A word from Pastor Justin

Mt. Pisgah Family,

It's hard to believe that the year 2025 is already drawing to a close! It feels like just yesterday that I began serving this wonderful congregation as pastor, and now it has been nearly a full year since officially accepting the call to Mt. Pisgah Lutheran Church. I continue to be amazed by the work of the Holy Spirit—within these walls, among our people, and throughout our wider community.

This past weekend, we joyfully celebrated the 508th anniversary of the Protestant Reformation alongside our Homecoming Sunday worship. The central message came from Paul's letter to the Romans (3:23–24): "Since all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God; they are now justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus." In other words, we are imperfect people doing our best to serve a perfect God. But the good news is that God isn't waiting for us to become perfect before having a relationship with us—Jesus has already made that possible through His sacrifice on the cross. This gospel of grace is the ultimate expression of God's love, freeing us to serve not because we must, but because we get to be part of God's kingdom in this world. What a joy that is!

As we reflect on this message from Reformation Sunday, I invite each of us to consider: have we truly embraced this message of grace in our faith and daily living? There is nothing to prove, boast about, or strive toward other than deepening our relationship with God through Jesus Christ. Grace reminds us that the hard work has already been done—our role now is to receive this gift and extend it to others.

Earlier this month, our Executive Council unveiled a new logo for our congregation (pictured below). The **Blue Ridge Mountains** reflect both our geographical setting in the foothills and the story of Moses standing on Mt. Pisgah, gazing upon the Promised Land. The **Star of Bethlehem**, a familiar symbol outside our church, reminds us of the hope and promise found in the birth of Jesus. And at the very center, the **Cross of Christ** anchors the image—and our community—in the One we serve.

As we live out this message of grace, my prayer is that this new image clearly communicates who we are: a people centered on God, guided by Christ, and called to share His light with the world. We do not serve for our own glory, but for the glory of God's kingdom. As we move into this holiday season, may we be a people of faith energized to serve a world in need, letting God's light guide our every step.

Stewardship Report for November & December 2025

In Christian stewardship, "time and talents" refer to resources God provides us, encompassing how we spend our time and the unique abilities and skills we possess. Christians are called to be good stewards of these gifts, dedicating them to God's purposes and using them to serve others and build up the church. This involves recognizing that these are not possessions to own, but rather gifts entrusted to us for which we are accountable.

Every individual receives the same 24 hours in a day, and Christians are encouraged to be wise and intentional in how to spend that time. This involves prioritizing activities that align with God's will and contribute to spiritual growth, rather than solely pursuing worldly endeavors. Examples would be spending time in prayer and Bible study, serving in church ministries, volunteering time to help others, and using time to build relationships with family and friends.

Talents are the unique skills, abilities, and gifts that God has given to each individual. These talents are not meant for personal gain or self-promotion, but rather for serving others and contributing to the well-being of the community and the church. Examples would be Musical abilities, teaching skills, administrative abilities, artistic talents, practical skills like fixing things, and the ability to connect with and encourage others. Christians are encouraged to identify, develop, and utilize their talents to the best of their ability for God's glory.

As stewards, Christians are accountable to God for how they use their time and talents. The goal of stewardship is to use these resources to advance God's kingdom, spread the Gospel, and demonstrate God's love to the world. Examples are participating in church activities, using talents to help those in need, giving generously of time and resources, and striving to live a life that reflects God's character.

In essence, the Christian concept of "time and talents" emphasizes that we are not owners of these resources, but rather managers entrusted with them by God. Our responsibility is to use them wisely and generously to serve God and others, ultimately contributing to the flourishing of His kingdom.

Treasury Report 10/23/25

Income for the first quarter of fiscal year 2025-2026 was \$129,913, which is 114% of the budget. That is mainly due to income for the month of July. August and September were both below budget, but hopefully that trend won't continue.

Expenses for the first quarter were \$114,243, which is 100.2% of budget. As you can see, we spent \$15,670 less than we received for the first quarter. We also have \$128,959 in the reserve account as of September 30th. We are in good shape financially at this point in the year.

On Sunday, Nov. 9, during both services, we will be hearing about the Christians of the Holy Land, and after each service we will be hosting at the church Narthex a nice display of handmade olive wood religious articles from Bethlehem available for purchase. These carvings include olivewood Nativity sets, crosses, Christmas ornaments, candle holders, angels and many other religious crafts that could make a nice wedding, baptism, confirmation, Easter and Christmas gifts. The carvings are handmade by Christian families from Bethlehem who rely on it for their daily bread.

More than 70% of the Christian Community in the Holy Land depend upon tourism as their only source of income. For decades those Christians have been enduring many hardships as tourism in Bethlehem has plummeted and access to other sources of income has been sharply restricted due to the ongoing conflict, the wars, the 12 yard wall built around Bethlehem, the COVID-19 pandemic, and nowadays the catastrophic ongoing war for the past two years, due to this tourists are afraid and unable to visit the Holy Land. This made it very difficult for the Christian families to find their daily bread and forced them to immigrate and flee their homeland since they lost their source of income. The Christian population of the Holy Land was 30% in the last century, today it is less than 1%. If it continues like this, in a few years we will find no Christians in the land of Christ, which could cause tragic consequences to our faith and holy sites.

Please help support our Christian brothers and sisters in the town of Bethlehem where Christ was born by purchasing their carvings.

A Christians family from Bethlehem will be telling us the story of the Christians of the Holy Land and they will be presenting these carvings after the services.






Men's Bible Study: The Book of Daniel

Join us as we learn from Daniel's example of courage and discover how to live faithfully in today's world.




Wednesday Bible

All are welcome—whether you're familiar with The Chosen or brand new to it. Come ready to watch, read, and share!






